Stocks end week in the basement

NEW YORK — U.S. stocks on Friday chalked up Wall Street's worst week in more than two years, as shaken investors contended with a world of economic worries

"People are worried about liquidity and where the economy is going, and don't see any sort of life preserver as yet," said Doug Roberts, chief investment strategist at Channel Capital Research.

On Friday, not even a better-than-expected July jobs report, which included upward revisions to May and June and a drop in the unemployment rate to 9.1 percent, 'could calm markets suspecting a snowballing crisis," noted Beth Ann Bovino, senior economist at Standard & Poor's

Trading in a more than 400-point range that had the blue chips up 171 points at the start and then down more than 200, the Dow Jones industrial average ended at 11,444.61, gaining 60.93 points, or 0.5 percent, for the session and curbing its weekly drop to a loss of 5.8 percent, the worst for the blue chips since March 6,

Down 7.2 percent from the previous week's close, its worst week since late 2008, the S&P 500 index fell nearly 1 point to 1,199.38, with financials down the most and consumer staples faring best among its 10 industry groups.

The Nasdaq composite index lapsed 23.98 points, or 0.9 percent, to 2,532.41, down 8 percent for the week, the index's hardest weekly hit since November 2008.

Reports that Italy and the European Union had agreed to economic reform measures fueled a burst higher.

"If there is one good thing out of this crisis, it is these countries are finally learning the desperate need to liberalize their economies," said Peter Boockvar, equity strategist at Miller Tabak.
