He is certified by the Reading Education Assistance Dogs team, Therapy Dogs Incorporated and is an American Kennel Club Canine Good Citizen. Benny will be joining us again on Thursday, March 1, at 11 AM. Homeschoolers, pre-schoolers, and adults of all ages are welcome to come and meet Benny.
